

NEK PCE Request for Applications

Questions

Q. In the Priority 2 and 3 categories you say that the total amount one can apply for is \$10,000, but last year's grantees got between \$10-\$25,000 Can one apply for more than \$10,000?

A. No, one cannot apply for more than \$10,000.

Q. Are single agencies allowed to apply for two priorities and be able to request up to \$10,000 for each priority?

A. Applicants are limited to one application per entity.

Q. Could an agency use some of this funding to help youth pay for a membership or subscription to access virtual medical care as long as there is a sustainability plan?

A. This may be allowable if it is directly related to the priority area described in your Project Description and Workplan. We would check with the ADAP PCE program manager to get approval.

Q. Intellectual property: If an organization submits a proposal to create and/or update an online training, will it be understood that that organization is the owner of that training and can market and distribute it as needed following the grant period?

This question came up in funding year 2021 and the PCE program manager approved the proposal in which the organization was the owner of the training. This would have to be approved for funding year 2022 by the PCE program manager.

Q. On P. 5 of the RFA, it states: Grantees will be expected to: *Share state and/or regional prevention messaging through channels such as Facebook, websites, and newsletters, as applicable. Messaging will be provided to grantees by the NEK-PCE marketing staff. *Disseminate information about training opportunities as requested by the NEK-PCE.

What is the nature of this messaging?

A. Examples of this messaging may be the promotion of National Drug Takeback Day, PCE regional prevention training, Alcohol Awareness Month, etc.
