Through serious application, relevant experiences, and professional guidance, students enrolled in a visual arts course at Lyndon Institute learn self-discipline and freedom of expression through a wide range of artistic opportunities. Simultaneously, they gain excellent preparation for college, a professional career in the arts, or the opportunity to enjoy and explore visual art. Lyndon Institute's Norris Center for the Arts houses a range of studio art classrooms, while the old campus school building houses Graphic Design with a state of the art MAC Lab and Production Room. Students can enroll in a Career and Technical Education Graphic Design Program that offers courses in graphic design and the creative software of Adobe Photoshop, Illustrator and In Design programs. Additionally, Lyndon Institute's Visual Arts Program includes professional instruction in AP Studio Art, ceramics, water-based painting, oil and acrylic painting, and various levels of studio art, which include focused instruction in printmaking, a wide range of drawing concepts and much more. Students enrolled in Graphic Design are eligible for college credit through an articulation agreement with Northern Vermont University. With participation in local and national art contests, students at Lyndon Institute have received awards from the Future Business Leaders of America



Organization, SkillsUSA Competitions, Congressional Art Competition, the Norwich University Juried High School Art Contest, and the National Junior Duck Stamp Competition. Lyndon Institute is also a proud sponsor of the National Art Honor Society, offering students the opportunity to promote the arts in their school and community. Students attend various art events in the New England area, including tours of the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston, the Hood Museum in New Hampshire, and the Portland Museum of Art in Maine. Students receive hands on experiential learning through various disciplines in art and design at Lyndon Institute.

Art Instructors include Alayne Tetor, Visual Arts Instructor of Intro to Studio Arts, AP Studio Arts, Ceramics and Sculpture, and National Art Honor Society Advisor; Barbara Follett, Visual Arts: Printmaking, Watercolor Painting, Oil and Acrylic Painting; and Bridget Atkins, CTE Instructor of Introduction to Graphic Design, Graphic Design I, Graphic Design II and Graphic Design III.
